Less than 50% of the seniors from the area high school attend four-year universities. The average ACT score of St. Martin parish is 17. Residents of Breaux Bridge earn an average of less than \$36,836 per year (2015); Louisiana’s median income is \$45,727. Breaux Bridge’s demographic is 52.8% Caucasian, 45.4% African American and less than 5% other (2015).
